


Housing Assistance

Housing assistance for low-income Missourians is provided through a patchwork of federal programs. The vast majority of these programs are operated by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) in partnership with state and local Housing Authorities.

In FY2016, 171,513 Missourians received federal housing assistance.

Primary HUD Programs

- Housing Choice Vouchers help low-income families pay for housing in the private market.
 These vouchers can be used for any private market rental.
- Section 8 Project-Based Rental Assistance subsidizes units in the private market. Unlike Housing Choice Vouchers, Section 8 assistance can only be used only for Section 8 units.
- **Public Housing** refers to public units managed by local housing agencies.
- The **Section 202 Program** provides supportive housing for seniors.
- The **Section 811 Program** provides supportive housing for people with disabilities.

^{*}Local Housing Authorities use HUD income limits to cap eligibility for specific programs, and to assign preference within programs. The majority of housing assistance recipients fall into the ELIor VLI categories. Income limits for specific Housing Authorities vary by geography, as they are based on local median incomes.
