

Changes to Missouri's TANF Cash Assistance Program Result in 60% Decline in Missouri Children & Families Assisted

Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) provides a modest cash benefit to Missouri families with children who earn less than \$18,780 per year for a family of three. Unlike other safety net services, cash assistance allows families to pay for basic necessities, such as toothpaste, diapers, and gas. The flexibility of cash helps families afford unexpected or irregular expenses like their children's school supplies or medication. **Currently, cash assistance helps support fewer than 10,000 Missouri families per month with an average monthly benefit of just \$223 per family.**

The number of families receiving cash assistance in Missouri has declined by 60% since 2015. While a portion of the decline in enrollment results from improvement in the economy, a sudden drop occurred immediately after the implementation of Senate Bill 24 (SB 24). The decline in enrollment during the period between December 2015-July 2016 (or the first 6 months following implementation of SB24) accounts for approximately 70% of the total statewide decline in enrollment since December 2015.

Senate Bill 24: Implemented January 1 2016

- Decreased the lifetime limit that families could receive assistance from 60 months to 45 months
- *Implemented full-family sanctions*, meaning that if one family member is non-compliant with eligibility rules, the entire family (including children) loses cash assistance, as opposed to just the member who is non-compliant¹.

SB 24 was implemented January 1, 2016 and by July of 2016 nearly 29,000 Missourians (nearly 2/3 of whom were children) lost cash assistance. This accounted for nearly half of all TANF recipients in Missouri.

Drop in TANF Consumers Since SB 24 Implementation Dec 2015




Between December 2015 and December 2018, 25,303 children and nearly 15,000 families lost TANF cash assistance, a decline of 60%

¹ A person is considered non-compliant if they fail to report at least 20 hours per week of work activity. Acceptable work activities include employment, job training, education, and volunteer service.

The bulk of this decline occurred between January and February 2016. Over 15,000 Missourians (including over 5,000 families and 9,500 children) lost assistance during this period. This is a 26% drop in enrollment in just one month. By contrast, the decline in enrollment for the same period in 2017 was only 1.8%.

As shown in Appendix 1, the decline in enrollment has been felt across Missouri with the largest declines occurring primarily in Missouri's rural counties.
